



In the back garden "jungle" shade trees dominate and root competition has also been a challenge. Plants such as bergonias, , abutilon, plectranthus, teucrium, clivias, arthropodium and part-shade salvias have been successful.

In the orchard there are dwarf fruit trees, apples, quince, pear, plum, peaches and nectarines. Self-sown seeds of larkspurs, lychnis, hollyhock, Queen Anne's lace, cornflower and feverfew fill in the space between the fruit trees especially through Spring and Summer.



The gardens that open for us are chosen to reflect a great diversity of styles and may even challenge the conventional view of what constitutes a garden.
